Blocked Sewer Line? Use Caution.

Some utilities, like gas, use trenchless technology to install new natural gas lines. Occasionally, these lines can intersect with other existing utility lines.

Under these circumstances, a natural gas line will remain in a safe condition if it is left alone. However, a serious safety risk could arise if power equipment is used to clear a sewer service line and causes damage to the natural gas line.

For that reason, if you, your plumber or contractor need to clear a blockage in a sewer service line beyond the outside wall of a home or business with rotating or water jetting (flushing) equipment, it is extremely important to obtain a natural gas line locate BEFORE attempting to clear it. Call 811 for a free utility line locate.

If you do not need to go beyond the outside wall of a building to fix the problem, or if you use a video inspection to confirm there is no natural gas line in the sewer, you do not need to obtain a natural gas locate. Visit our website for more information about sewer safety.

Maintaining Chimney and Flues



Maintaining chimneys and flue pipes is an important safety requirement. Now that the cold weather is coming, we recommend customers have a licensed heating contractor inspect their chimneys and flue pipes for safe operation. Chimneys and flue pipes should be checked for soot, residue or any other obstructions that
